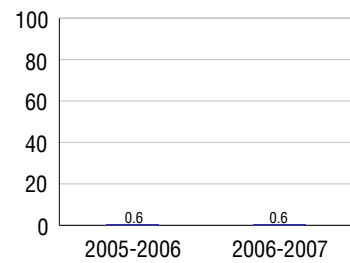

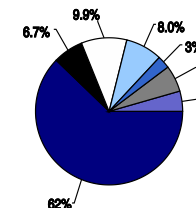

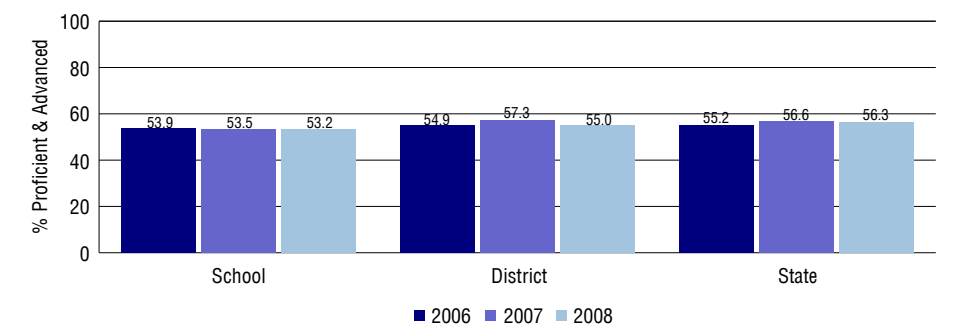
Overall Academic Performance on State Assessments

The rating is calculated using weighted percentages of each CSAP proficiency level for all content area and grade results for the school, as well as average COACT Reading, Writing, and Math Grade 11 results.

Academic Growth of Students

Percent Proficient and Advanced for Middle Grades for All Content Areas



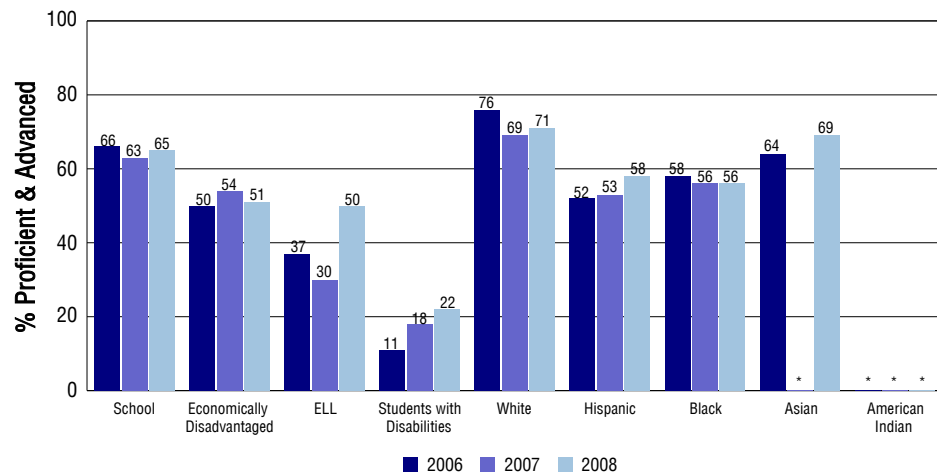

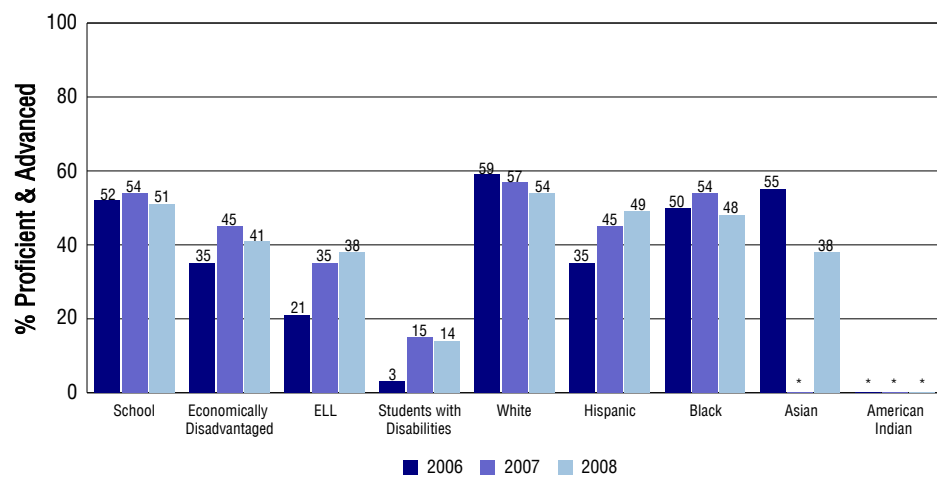

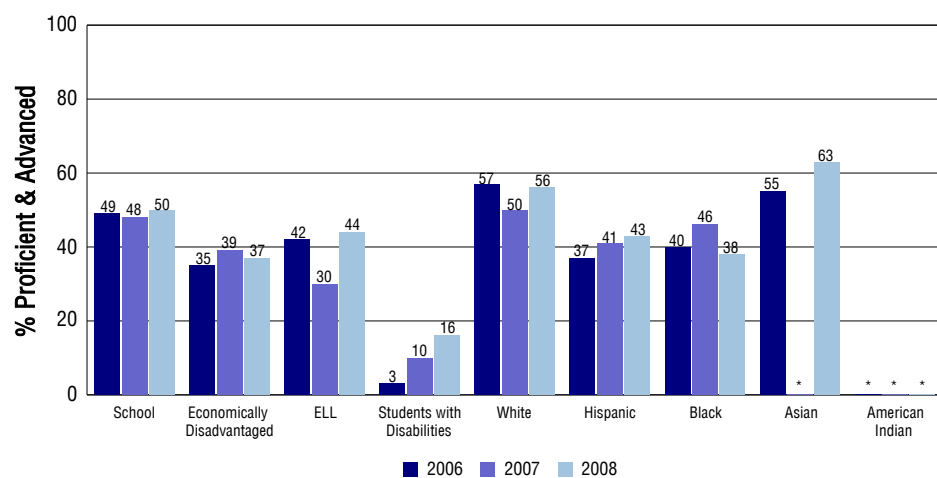
Reading
